Manifesto of the Social-Democratic Party of Ceticilia



THE SOCIAL-DEMOCRATIC PARTY OF CETICILIA HEREBY PROMISES TO ACCEPT AND ADHERE TO THE NATIONAL CONSTITUTION OF THE REPUBLIC OF CETICILIA Preamble:

The social-democratic party believes in a society where everyone can live to their full potential, we believe in a republic where everyone has a say and the security of the citizenry is secured.

The Social-Democratic Party will be refferred to as "The Party" throughout this document.

The abbreviation "SPC" is the short form of the German "Sozialdemokratische Partei Ceticiliens"

The head of the Social-Democratic Party is Aqua.

Equal rights:

- The Party aims for a society blind to race, gender and to encourage peace amongst all people.
- The Party aims for a society where anyone, regardless of class, income, gender or race has access to basic healthcare and resources.

Personal freedoms and rights:

- All persons should have personal freedoms such as right to free development of personality, freedom of faith and conscience, freedom of speech, freedom of press and the right to human dignity.
- We believe the government does not have the right to spy onto the citizenry unless a person is a highly-potential threat to Ceticilian security.

Expansion of judiciary:

 The Party aims for a judiciary of sufficient size and that the federal court may not be single-handedly ruled by the Chief Justice.

Expansion of online presence and expansion of state:

- The Party aims for an expansion of the Ceticilian nation online, as well as by means of physical territory.
- The Party aims for a decentralized voting system.
- The Party believes in the right of net neutrality.

Voting system:

 The Party believes that citizens shall have the right to vote online as well as physical ballots.

- The Party believes in a transferable voting system for single candidates.
- The Party believes there shall be no random tie breaking.

Ministries and councils:

- The Party believes that ministries' and councils' heads may create an assembly on their own and that they shall regulate, internally democratically, how they operate.
- Councils shall be responsible for national affairs such as cartographing, statistics and how to break ties in a Single Transferable Vote.
