Preface:

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On 27 October 2023, the Office of the Presidency of the Arstotzkan Union began to ponder the threat posed by TikTok on national security and the privacy of the citizens of the Independent Federal Republic of the Arstotzkan Union. Previously the application had been banned under the Entertainment and Social Media Restrictions and Censorship Act 2020. This was later overturned through presidential oversight

and the widespread usage of the application by members of the Arstotzkan Federal Government.

The possibility of an international ban led by the United States of America had been rumoured around this time and so the First President of the Arstotzkan Union along with the Chairman of National Security Division and the Chairman of the Intelligence Division of the State Committee of the National Security and Intelligence (Arstotzkan Union) met to plan a major intelligence operation to investigate the claims of the threats posed by the application.

Two weeks later, the State Committee of National Security and Intelligence decided to make this a larger scale investigation and reached out to the Collective Intelligence Office (CIO) of the United Micronations Treaty Alliance and formed the Temporary Joint Intelligence Committee (TJIC).

With many cyber warfare teams used by the CIO and UMTA located in the Allied Micronational Treaty Organization (AMTO), the organization was also recruited to join the TJIC through a newly created branch known as the International Intelligence Office (IIO).

Contents:

1 Investigation:

From 12 November 2023 until 28 March 2024, the various intelligence offices analysed several years' worth of data collection by the application known as TikTok.

Cyber experts from the IIO looked into the source code of the application while legal experts and government investigators of the SCNSI and HM (Ward Empire) looked into the policies and political affiliates of the members of the senior staff of ByteDance and TikTok.

In total a 463-page document of all evidence was produced. This document is the simplified version produced, which is more credible and intelligible than the longer version. By order of the Temporary Joint Intelligence

Committee and its members, the longer version is to be classified until the TikTok ban in the United States is complete.

2 Findings:

It is through unanimous agreement of the Temporary Joint Intelligence Committee, that the internet application known as TikTok does not pose a threat to national security of any nation in the United Micronations Treaty Alliance.

We find that American based social media platforms collect more data on users than TikTok and in truth, pose a greater threat to national security and the lives of all persons of the members states involved in this report.
